Foreword of Péter Sztáray, State Secretary for Security Policy of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Trade

Dear Reader,

Hungary has held the Presidency of the Committee of Ministers of the Council of Europe from the 21st of May until the 17th of November in 2021. Since our accession to the Council of Europe in 1990, Hungary has chaired the Committee of Ministers for the second time. This period is always s pecial for every member state, as it only occurs every 23 years.

Our Presidency took place in a challenging environment. We had to tackle the consequences of the pandemic, start economic and social recovery programs,



we had to acknowledge the beginning of a new era of geopolitical conflicts, and we are still facing increased migratory pressures from different directions.

Even though we had to confront the difficulties of the pandemic, we still held the overwhelming majority of our 70 events and cultural programmes in person. Our priorities focused on issues that required our immediate joint and thorough political attention, such as the effective protection of national minorities, interreligious dialogue also focusing on the protection of persecuted Christians, as well as diverse topics related to future generations, future challenges and environmental protection.

Dear Reader,

This publication was edited to provide a brief overview of this wide range of events, capturing the highlights of our Presidency. I hope that those interested will find it a useful read.

It is my sincere hope that the Hungarian Presidency of the Council of Europe provided an opportunity to further Hungarian national interests within the Council of Europe while also striving to find synergies between Hungarian priorities and those of the organization.

Ceremonial issue of commemorative stamps and coins on the occasion of the Hungarian Presidency of the Committee of Ministers of the Council of Europe

Budapest, 18 May 2021

Mr. Péter Sztáray, State Secretary for Security Policy of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Trade presented the commemorative coin together with Mr. Marcell Horváth, Head of the Executive Directorate for International Relations of the Hungarian National Bank on the occasion of the Hungarian Presidency.

The coin symbolises European unity and Pan-European spirit. On the front, it features a Europe-centric globe, seen from outer space. On the back, it features the official logo of the Hungarian Presidency of the Council of Europe. The coin, designed by artist Mr. Balázs Bitó, has been issued in a limited edition of 7 000 pieces.

On the same day, Mr. Péter Sztáray and Ms. Sára Hegmanné Nemes, President of the Hungarian Post Office also presented the commemorative stamp. The stamp, which was issued in 50 000 copies, was designed by artist Mr. André Attila Elekes, and it features the European Universum tapestry. The tapestry was the Hungarian Presidency's traditional presidency gift to the Council of Europe (as seen on pages 63 and 64).

131st Session of the Committee of Ministers: Takeover of the Presidency from Germany

Hamburg, 21 May 2021

At its 131st Session on 21 May 2021, the Committee of Ministers stressed the Council of Europe's important standard-setting work on protecting human rights in the digital age and acknowledged that digital development and artificial intelligence both bring benefits to societies but also pose significant challenges.

Hungary took over the Presidency of the Committee of Ministers of the Council of Europe from Germany during a hybrid meeting with representatives of the Organisation's 47 Member States.

Mr. Heiko Maas, Federal Minister for Foreign Affairs of Germany, gave an overview of his country's achievements during its Presidency. The new Chair of the Committee of Ministers, Mr. Péter Szijjártó, Minister of Foreign Affairs and Trade of Hungary then presented the priorities of the Hungarian Presidency for the next six months.

These priorities included: promoting the effective protection of national minorities; supporting inter-religious dialogue; issues related to future generations: children's rights, youth inclusion and Roma integration; future challenges such as cybercrime and artificial intelligence; and last, but not least, addressing environmental challenges.

11th Conference on the European Landscape Convention

Strasbourg, 26-27 May 2021

The 11th Conference on the European Landscape Convention was held online on 26-27 May 2021 in the framework of the Hungarian Presidency.

The aim of the event was to present the progress of the Work Programme and to deal with questions concerning its implementation.

The conference was opened by Mr. Bjørn Berge, Deputy Secretary General of the Council of Europe. On behalf of Hungary, Mr. István Nagy, Minister of Agriculture of Hungary and Mr. Harry Alex Rusz, Permanent Representative of Hungary to the Council of Europe welcomed the attendees. The conference was chaired by Ms. Krisztina Kincses representing the Hungarian Ministry of Agriculture.

The European Landscape Convention, adopted in 2000, aims to promote landscape protection, management and planning, and to enhance international co-operation. To date, fourty Member States have ratified the Convention. With the ratification of the Protocol Amending the Convention on 1 July 2021, it is also open for accession by non-European States.

Session of the Standing Committee of the Parliamentary Assembly of the Council of Europe

Budapest, 28 May 2021

Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the Standing Committee of the Parliamentary Assembly of the Council of Europe (PACE) met in a hybrid conference on 28 May 2021.

After the opening of the meeting by President Rik Daems, the parliamentarians held an exchange of views with Mr. Levente Magyar, Deputy Minister, Parliamentary State Secretary, Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Trade of Hungary. The discussion focused on topical issues in the framework of the Assembly's ongoing political dialogue with the Committee of Ministers.

The parliamentarians had debates on current affairs, notably the Middle East Peace Process and the situation in Belarus. Other items on the agenda included debates on the role of young people in the prevention and resolution of conflicts, the budget of the Council of Europe (2022-2025) and the expenditures of the Assembly (2022-2023), the observation of recent parliamentary elections in Bulgaria and Albania, the role of parliaments in implementing the UN global compact for migrants and refugees and the humanitarian action for refugees and migrants in the Middle East and North Africa.

The first meeting of the Committee of Ministers of the Council of Europe under the Hungarian Presidency took place on 2-3 June 2021 in a hybrid format.

Secretary General Marija Pejčinović Burić announced, among others, the launch of the nomination process for the 2022 edition of the Council of Europe's Wallenberg Prize, co-founded by Sweden and Hungary.

At the meeting, Hungary outlined the professional and cultural event series of its six-month Presidency.

Nicosia, 10-12 June 2021



The Parliamentary Assembly of the Council of Europe held its summer session in Strasbourg from 20-24 June 2021.

The Hungarian National Assembly was represented by Mr. Zsolt Németh (Head of Delegation), Mr. Barna Pál Zsigmond, Ms. Katalin Csöbör, Ms. Mónika Bartos, Mr. Attila Tilki, Mr. Zsolt Csenger-Zalán; Mr. Lőrinc Nacsa, Ms. Hajnalka Juhász; Ms. Zita Gurmai, and Mr. Koloman Brenner.

On 21 June 2021, Mr. Péter Szijjártó, Minister of Foreign Affairs and Trade of Hungary presented the Communication from the 131st session of the Committee of Ministers to the Parliamentary Assembly. The Minister also elaborated on the priorities of the Hungarian Presidency.

Among other things, the Assembly discussed the following reports: progress report on political events, women in politics, European diaspora policy, Afrophobia and transparency in election campaigns and the related financing of political parties. On 22 June 2021, Mr. Péter Szijjártó, Minister of Foreign Affairs and Trade of Hungary visited the Donbass region as the Chairman of the Committee of Ministers.

The Committee of Ministers attaches particular importance to ensure and respect the human rights of all people living in Eastern Ukraine.

Although the Council of Europe stays away from military conflicts, as Chairman of the Committee of Ministers, Minister Szijjártó visited the conflict area to send a positive message to a region, where thousands of citizens have been suffering the consequences of war for years.

Hungary offered €160 000 as a voluntary financial contribution for the implementation of the Council of Europe's Ukraine Action Plan.

Strasbourg, 29 June 2021

On 29 June 2021, a high-level conference titled 'Norms and Standards of the Council of Europe on National Minorities: Results and Challenges' took place under the auspices of the Hungarian Presidency.

The event was opened by Ms. Marija Pejčinović Burić, Secretary General of the Council of Europe, and Mr. Gergely Gulyás, Head of the Prime Minister's Office.

Speakers included Mr. Ferenc Kalmár, Ministerial Commissioner for Neighbourhood Policy; Ms. Dunja Mijatović, Council of Europe Commissioner for Human Rights; Ms. Vesna Crnić-Grotić, former Chair of the Committee of Experts on the Language Charter; Ms. Marie Hagsgård, Chair of the Advisory Committee to the Framework Convention for the Protection of Minorities; Ms. Erzsébet Szalayné Sándor, Deputy Nationality Ombudsman, expert of the Advisory Committee of the Framework Convention for the Protection of Minorities and Mr. Vello Pettai, Director of the European Centre for Minority Affairs (ECMI).

The aim of the conference was to assess the achievements and identify challenges in the field of protecting national minority rights in Europe. It was also an opportunity to examine the results of the reform of the two monitoring mechanisms on national minorities and minority languages carried out since 2018.

Launch of the Human Rights Handbook

Budapest, 12 July 2021

The intergovernmental Human Rights Working Group, whose work is coordinated by the Ministry of Justice of Hungary, launched the Human Rights Handbook on 12 July 2021 in Budapest in the presence of the Diplomatic Corps of the Member States and Observers of the Council of Europe.

The Handbook aims to support dialogue within the Organisation on questions related to human and fundamental rights. It also strives to provide a brief introduction to basic human rights concepts, the institutional system based on the Fundamental Law of Hungary, specific sectoral rules and their implementation, and the Hungarian Government's efforts to promote human rights.

The Diplomatic Corps was addressed by Ms. Anikó Raisz, State Secretary for Public Administration and Mr. Pál Völner, Deputy Minister of Justice and Chairman of the Human Rights Working Group, who presented the Human Rights Handbook.

The 'Iron Curtain' Route exhibition showcased the line of the former Iron Curtain that divided Europe from the Barents Sea to the Black Sea through fifteen countries. Both cultural routes won the 'Council of Europe Cultural Route of the Year' prize in 2019.

From 16 September to 20 October 2021, an outdoor exhibition titled 'Cultural Routes and Innovation in Hungary' took place in the Museum of Fine Arts of Hungary. The exhibition was opened by Mr. Miklós Kásler, Minister of Human Capacities of Hungary. The organisers's aim was to show the art world's work during the COVID-19 pandemic as well as to present nine cultural routes in Hungary. At the heart of the initiative was the award-winning installation titled 'Endless Dune', which illustrated isolation from the outside world.




Conference on 'Slow or Eco-Designed Cultural Tourism in Europe'

On 11-12 November 2021, honouring the 70th anniversary of the European Convention on Human Rights, the Ministry of Justice of Hungary organised a conference entitled 'The European Convention on Human Rights and its Case Law in the Application of Domestic Courts'.

The aim was to provide an overview of the implementation of the European Court of Human Rights' judgments by the domestic courts, and to examine the application of the Court's caselaw in light of the caselaw of the domestic courts and the Constitutional Court of Hungary.

On 17 November 2021 Mr. Péter Szijjártó, Minister of Foreign Affairs and Trade of Hungary handed over the Chairmanship of the Committee of Ministers of the Council of Europe to Mr. Luigi Di Maio, Minister for Foreign Affairs and International Cooperation of Italy.
